Not Quite Home

For the last several months Pam and I have been suffering through the well-known malady commonly called “Empty Nest Syndrome.” Erin began her third year at Marshall, Allie started her first year at Concord and of course, Leslie continues to live in Canton, OH with her husband and five children.

To say that the house has been quiet is a bit of an understatement. (However, we have noticed that at least once each evening our cats decide to get into some disagreement with one another which is both annoying and nostalgic at the same time. At least the girls never got to the point of “flying fur” in their rare moments of disagreement.)

I know that this is a phenomenon that many of the households of First UMC have experienced and one that I know many more will be experiencing in the not too distant future. Let me share a couple of lessons that have been helpful to me over the past few months...

I am so very happy that Pam and I invested early in making our relationship the most important thing in our lives and in our children’s lives. There were many occasions when the girls were growing up that “the kids did not come first”. This was quite intentional by Pam and me because (a) we wanted our girls to see what a healthy marriage looks like; and (b) we knew the day was coming when it would be just the two of us again and we didn’t want there to be a great amount of awkwardness. Looking back, I’m still extremely glad that we made this decision. I know that my girls are prepared to “work” when marriage arrives for them. I’m also very glad my best friend in the world still can stand to live with me in the same home!

No matter how much you think you are ready for the changes that being an “empty nester” will bring you – you are not ready. I still walk by empty bedrooms, go and sit on the edge of a bed and wish I could hug one of the girls just one more time. I still want to share things with them when I get home. I text more, now. I look forward to (most) of their phone calls. I love hearing their voices and most of all, I love knowing that they are becoming the fine, strong, faith-filled young women that God intended them to be.

I am still Dad even though there are no children in the house. That was an unusual lesson for me to learn. I never really thought about it till the kids were gone, but “Dad” has become a permanent part of my identity. To the new Dads out there...remember that. To those who are further along the path of empty nesting...hold on to that.

I am now really, really, looking forward to the holidays and all that it will bring. The house will be chaotic and festive. I will have to fight for bathroom time. I will have to put up with the smell of body spray. I will probably have to go around and turn off lights in unused rooms. I will hear more laughter. I will get more hugs. I look forward to these days ahead called “holidays” and to me, they will be especially “Holy Days.”

I realize that for many of you, this is old hat. For some of you, it is something you can’t fathom to think about yet. (For still others, who are bearing the pain of waiting for a child, or who have gone through life wanting and not receiving a child, I realize that this has probably felt a bit self-





Feeding Hungry Children Update

November is our usually a special time to express our gratitude to God for our many blessings. For the past couple years, the Feeding Hungry Children Team has offered this congregation the opportunity to translate that gratitude into material blessings for the children in our area who are at risk of not having adequate food on the weekend when they don't have school meals. This year the team was asked to provide food for Glenwood School and we decided that we would do our best to provide for the Princeton area children God brought to us. With the addition of Glenwood and the increase in need at some of the other schools, our total is now at 151 students being served each week. This year we are offering the congregation the opportunity to sponsor one or more children in the program for as many months as desired. Fifteen dollars provides a child with a bag of weekend food for a month (four weekends). The children of our church will place turkey hands on a giant turkey in the front of the sanctuary representing each month of sponsorship.

In the spirit of offering special gratitude, we want to offer our thanks to this amazing congregation. Your love and heart for serving has been overwhelming and I know you make God happy each time you think of ways to help those who need your blessings.

TLC will be celebrating its 2nd year anniversary in January. The participants have developed a powerful sisterhood and commitment to meet the needs of others through sewing, crocheting, quilting, and knitting.

Since the last submission to the Remarker, TLC has added a new benefactor for the Newborn and Premie hats: the Ronald McDonald House in Charleston. We are working on our 2nd 1000 little hats that continue to go to the following hospitals: Princeton Community Hospital, Bluefield Regional, Welch Community, and Greenbrier Medical. We sent a large box of booties and car seat afghans to Welch Community Clinic.

TLC was able to honor Scott with an incredibly gorgeous stole that was made to add to his collection. The beautiful reversible stole in blues and purples will be an added touch to Lent and Advent. The stole was passed around to church members who wished to offer blessings for his ministry at FUMC.

The last weekend of October was Blanket Day. More than 20 individuals participated to create 40 blankets that will go to the nursing homes through the United Methodist Women, Mary's Cradle, the Children's Home Society, and other needs in the church. Members, friends, and students from Concord participated in the event. We were on WVVA for the 2nd year in a row!

Another big project has been the partnering of TLC with Feeding the Hungry Children. We have been selling hats and scarves, character hats, shawls, and boot cuffs. In addition to selling to church members, we have been taking orders from friends and as of this date, have generated enough to feed 5 children for a year. Our motto is, for every two sets of boot cuffs, you are buying food to feed a child for a month.

We are in awe of how our hands meet the needs of so many!

The Bishop's Commission on the Way Forward

Washington, D.C. The United Methodist Council of Bishops has announced the membership of the Commission on a Way Forward.

"After three months of diligent and prayerful discernment, we have selected 8 bishops, 11 laity, 11 elders and 2 deacons to serve on the Commission," said Bishop Bruce R. Ough, president of the Council of Bishops. "This group is representative of our theological diversity."

Ough said the makeup of the 32-member commission is roughly comparable to U.S. and Central Conference membership.

All of the members of the Commission have already indicated their willingness and availability to serve. The team of moderators -- Bishop Ken Carter, Bishop Sandra Steiner-Ball and Bishop David Yemba -- will soon convene the Commission to begin to organize their work and finalize their meeting schedule.

The Commission's mission is to "bring together persons deeply committed to the future(s) of The United Methodist Church, with an openness to developing new relationships with each other and exploring the potential future(s) of our denomination in light of General Conference and subsequent annual, jurisdictional and central conference actions."

The 2016 General Conference gave a specific mandate to the Council of Bishops to lead The United Methodist Church in discerning and proposing a way forward through the present impasse related to human sexuality and the consequent questions about unity and covenant.

The Commission is a group appointed by the Council of Bishops to assist the Council in fulfilling this mandate. As such, the Council has appointed bishops from across the global connection to serve on the Commission alongside laity and clergy. While clergy and laity will vote at a General Conference on these matters, the bishops have the responsibility to lead the church. Thus, the Commission is designed to inform the Council's leadership of the General Conference. After hearing concerns that the proposed composition did not include enough laity, three additional laypersons were added from the original pool of more than 300 nominees.

At their fall meeting (October 30 – November 2), the Council will make a decision about a called General Conference and will review a plan to conduct additional and complementary work in annual conferences designed to broaden the conversation with hundreds of lay and clergy members.
