C.I.A. YOUTH

Fall is just around the corner and this time of year is always an exciting time for our students and our youth ministry! The new school year means our students are in full swing at their after school programs: sports, dance, clubs, and many other aspects of their community involvement. Take a second to pray for them and our families!

Also, our youth program is back and in full swing! This means we are back to having Sunday School, Sunday Evening Discipleship Training, Game Night once a month, and Wednesday Night Bible Study, which is now a part of our church-wide Wednesday LINC.

The staff and I are working hard to provide something for everyone during these meeting times. As the youth director, I am not hoping just that our young people attend during these times, but to see and know that the student's whole family is attending our programming. But, I do focus on the youth ministry side and each aspect of the meetings help develop the student's Christian education.

Sunday School – Sundays at 9:30AM - We are exploring the stories of the Bible our students have grown up with, but how it affects them now and how each story helps tell the bigger story as we follow the thread of the Gospel from Genesis to Revelation.

Sunday Evening Discipleship Training – Sunday Evenings from 4 to 5:30PM – We are studying how we can be better disciples of Christ, what that means, and how we grow and mature into a disciple of Christ.

Wednesday Night Bible Study – Wednesday Nights from 6 to 7:30PM – This is a more indepth Bible study focused on different topics that our students face or hear about during their daily lives. Topics that arise at church, school, and everyday situations.

Our young people will be bringing back the Flamingo Fundraiser in September. From September 15th – 27th the flamingos will be migrating from yard to yard. The church family will have 2 weeks to buy insurance – September 1st and September 8th. If you purchased insurance or got flocked by the flamingos this summer you can get a special insurance discount for \$10. New flamingo insurance purchases will be \$20 and to have the flamingos removed and placed on another yard will be \$30.

Also, Upward is right around the corner. The brochures will be handed out to almost every school in Mercer County. Evaluations will be the first two weeks of October with practice starting in November after Thanksgiving. Please be in prayer for another great year of participation in our Upward program, volunteers willing to come forward and help out with the program, how you can help with the program this season, and myself as the director for the upcoming year. But, most importantly be in prayer that we as a church and volunteers will show the children the love of Christ, be an inviting and welcoming program, and that anyone who doesn't know Christ may come to know His love and grace!



We will be kicking off our Children's Fellowship Time with great actors Stan Tucker and Bob Davis portraying the apostle Paul and his Greek friend Dionysius meeting and discussing Paul's mission to tell the Greek people about Jesus. VBS director Stephanie Bowling will once again be leading the music station, where the kids will be learning worship songs: one with a Greek theme and dance! Martha Cook will be listening to the weekly Bible verses and keeping track of the points the kids earn for participation in Sunday School and church services, music activities, memory work, attendance,
