Every year, the West Virginia Annual Conference throws a CELEBRATION OF MISSIONS EVENT, known as Music in the Mountains.

Local churches send a choir/music ensemble to a parish "hymn sing" to praise God and raise money for conference missions. Our Chancel Choir is busy preparing to represent us at the Princeton Parish event which you can attend on March 29 at 6pm at Bethel United Methodist Church.

The local church who raises the most money (per capita based on average attendance) for the selected Conference missions will get to move on to the District Event.

How You Can Help

1. Buy a Square for Our Music Ministries

Each square in our Celebration of Missions Event grid is worth the number on it. (Square 1 costs \$1.00, Square 22 costs \$22.00, etc.) We invite you to choose a square and decorate it with messages of encouragement and gratitude for our Music Ministries. After decorating, return your square back in the grid. Money and squares are due March 22! Please turn in your payment with an offering envelope marked "Music Square." This money will support the following Conference Missions:

New Vision Depot in Beaver, WV: This warehouse acts as the main hub for Disaster Relief Ministry of the West Virginia Annual Conference.

Heart & Hand Outreach Ministries in Charleston, WV: This ministry provides a food pantry, emergency assistance, and thrift store.

2. Donate Flood Bucket Items

We want to send as many Flood Bucket Cleaning Kits to the New Vision Depot as we can. These buckets are crucial to provide disaster relief for West Virginia residents who have been impacted by flooding.

The shopping list for these buckets includes:

- 5 gallon buckets with resealable lids (no screw lids)
- 32-64oz bottles of liquid laundry detergent
- 16-40oz bottles liquid concentrate household cleaner (no spray cleaners)
- 16-34oz bottles dish soap
- 4-8oz pump spray air freshener
- 6-14oz pump spray insect repellent (or pack of 10-20 wipes are also acceptable)
- Scrub brushes
- Re-usable cleaning wipes (no terry cloth, microfiber, or paper towels)
- Scouring pads (Scotch Brite type)
- Wood clothespins
- 50-100ft clothesline (cotton or plastic)
- Heavy duty trash bags (33-45gallon)
- N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3mm thickness)
- Kitchen gloves
- Work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)

Please have all supplies in by March 22. Our Youth will pack these buckets during their 30-for-70 event.

TO RECAP: Let's represent FUMC Princeton and support these important missions by buying squares and donating flood bucket supplies by March 22.

Greetings Church Family!

This time of year seems to be the busiest time of year for me. Between the time of the last *Remarker* to now, it seems as though I am non-stop working with Upward and our Student Ministries. It is a hectic season and there are times I don't know if we will have enough volunteers, if we will be able to pull off games, or I worry about making sure the youth ministries doesn't skip a beat with everything else grabbing for my attention. I write all of this because in the midst of the chaos and worry, God still provides and shows His hand among the ministries that are working here at FUMC.

Our youth ministries and students continue to meet regularly on Wednesday and Sunday evenings. After Discipleship Training on Sunday Evenings we have opened the gym for our students and families to come and play basketball. We have had a great turnout and this continues to grow. It is encouraging to see families come and spend time together.



We recently got back from an incredible weekend at Resurrection in Pigeon Forge, TN. This is a conference put on through the Holston Conference. Rez was January 24-26th, and we took 36 people (15 leaders, adults, parents, and friends of the youth group and 21 students) to experience the four-session conference. The conference is split into two different sessions and I don't know exactly how

many people were there, but I would imagine that over 5,000 people attended each session for a total of 10,000 people coming to hear God's Word and worship Him in Pigeon Forge. Our students got to experience being the church as modeled after the first Christian Church in Acts. We fellowshipped, worshiped, learned, and studied Christ's teachings, cooked and ate meals, and had fun together! It was an incredible weekend where we got to experience the Spirit of God moving in the lives of young people and leaders by accepting Christ for the first time, rededicating their life, and answering the call to full-time ministry. Part of me felt bad for taking such a large number out of the congregation here at FUMC on that Sunday morning, but the other part of me felt terrible for everyone who couldn't be there with us and experience the weekend that we had together!

There are two events coming up in March where you can help support these amazing students! The first is our final Higher Education Grant Fund Fundraiser for the school year, which is our St. Patrick's Day Dinner right after church on Sunday, March 15th. All the proceeds will go towards the student's higher education after they graduate from high school. The second is our annual 30-for-70 fast. This is a 30-hour fast where our students have a friendly competition and raise money for our Feeding Hungry Children ministry. All the money collected at this event goes right to Feeding Hungry Children and helps them continue to feed children in Mercer County schools with the food bags that get delivered every Friday. If you already give to or want to give directly to Feeding Hungry Children, this would be a perfect way to be part of the fun and competition and find a student to donate the funds through in the month of March. 30-for-70 will be Friday, March 27th and Saturday, March 28th.

Upward Basketball is nearing the end of the season with only one Saturday of games left – Feb 29. We will have our Upward Awards Celebration on Saturday, March 7th. At the Awards we will celebrate our young athletes and cheerleaders as well as enjoy the entertainment and gospel presentation from Epic Entertainment.



A Reflection and a Thank-You

My last day as Church Administrator is February 27. Over two and a half years ago, I got a call late on a Sunday evening asking me to fill in for a week, and I'm only just now leaving. My time working in the office has been such a blessing. Your staff members at FUMC, past and present, have all been such committed partners in ministry with giant hearts, and working with them has been some of the most fulfilling work of my life.

I take with me so many lessons, but the one I want to highlight here is just how many loving and hard-working volunteers make this church go. Early on, I was astounded by how much is done invisibly by people who quietly go about duties that must be completed. From walking the campus twice a day to check for problems, emptying dehumidifiers, weeding flower gardens, crocheting and sewing and weaving, blowing leaves, preparing the chancel and sanctuary, cleaning the pews, working on the website, making magic happen in the tech booth, greeting



guests, giving tithes and offerings, serving on committees, coming to meetings, packing and delivering food, making tough decisions, singing, playing, directing, acting, visiting your stressed out administrator with coffee or avocados or a laugh, taking donations to the parish house, folding issues of *The Remarker*, donating your time and expertise, counting money, maintaining the membership book, visiting the homebound, preparing bereavement dinners, praying, visiting, calling, sending cards, teaching, checking a box on a Connect Card and showing up, and on, and on – this church and its mission to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ relies on all of you. Time and time again, I've seen you answer the call.

In his book *Living Together*, Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes, "Christian community is not an ideal we have to realize, but rather a reality created by God in Christ in which we may participate. The more clearly we learn to recognize that the ground and strength and promise of all our community is in Jesus Christ alone, the more calmly we will learn to think about our community and pray and hope for it."

The unexpected blessing of this job has been the revelation that so many people can come together because of what Jesus has done and continues to do for them. His love drives people with different opinions and thoughts and priorities and desires to join hands with Him and *do the work*. It can only be Him. My hope is that we continue to see Him in our brothers and sisters in the pews and those who walk by us outside these walls. My prayer is that we see Him even more fully each day and submit to the truth that a church, that the Church, belongs to Him – is His very body, and not ours.

I don't know how to thank each and every one of you for how you've given me grace, taught me about love, and helped me in countless ways, but that won't stop me from trying with the simplest expression: Thank you.

And I thank God for you because each and every one of you belongs to and is so fully loved by Him.

We Escaped from Egypt!!

With the wonderful involvement of our talented church family and parents, the children were enabled to experience the ups and downs, and trials and tribulations faced by the Israelites as they were led by Moses in their escape from Pharaoh's tyrannical rule.

Engaging storyteller Becky Kidwell began our journey by relating how Moses' life was spared by being placed in a basket by his mother and sister (Stephanie Bowling and Kaitlyn Artrip), traveling down the Nile until he was rescued by Pharaoh's daughter (Ella Bailey). The following week, Becky Veneri, dressed as a beautiful Egyptian, explained the vast differences between the daily lives of the Egyptians and the Israelite slaves and later, at the end of the session, provided the experience for the children of being supernaturally fed the miraculous fare from heaven of manna and

quail each day. Tom Bay, being fanned by slaves (Jersey and Jilly Pritchett) portrayed a very scary Pharaoh, describing his dealings with Moses as he was interviewed by Joanna Williams. Larry Cook joined us this evening by recording this interview and we are thankful to him for posting it on our website. We are grateful to Roger Topping for playing God, as he encountered Moses at the burning bush, as well as Moses as he led his people through the Red Sea. The ever-versatile Bob Davis gave generously of his Wednesday evenings, playing different roles - Moses (three times!) and the Wilderness Whiner (three times!), who represented the complaining group of Israelites Moses dealt with each day. Retired teacher Jeff McNew was able to join us for the first time this session to share the serious consequences of breaking God's laws by setting off a mousetrap as he reviewed each of the Ten Commandments.

I felt like it was a miracle that we had enough volunteers to provide an experience for each plague in several different locations throughout both church buildings! Many thanks to Marcia Anderson, Martha Cook, Patty Flanagan, Cathy Linkous, Vicki Horton, Lynsey Artrip, Robin Bailey, Stephanie

Bowling, Adam Sarver, Grace and William Farley, and Bob Davis for bringing the effects of each plague to life in this engaging and memorable lesson.

Martha Cook faithfully listened to the weekly Bible verses, as well as keeping track of the kids' church participation points for which they will be rewarded with prizes thoughtfully purchased by Martha on Show Off night.

Marcia Anderson continued to provide weekly support with both preparation and station management and spent weeks looking for appropriate treats and gifts to help the children remember the events Moses endured on his journey to freedom. Her treat bags are always a hit on Show Off night.

Both of these ladies enhance the CFT sessions tremendously with their wealth of experience and commitment to the children's Bible learning.

Finally, I can't thank Stephanie Bowling enough for her recently-added, weekly music station, which has proven to be a enriching **CFT** very station. Reviewing the lessons through song has reinforced this theme and introduced the kids to the history and culture of the



Israelites during this challenging time. She went above and beyond in explaining the meaning of the lyrics she introduced.

Stephanie was joined by Rick Dooley on guitar in recent weeks, as they worked together to prepare for their opening song on Show Off night! We are very grateful for Rick accompanying us on the "Pharaoh" song, which definitely kicks up the performance a notch!!

GLORY SIGHTINGS from 2019

As a congregation, we should give thanks to God for allowing us to reach our goal of paying 100% of our Conference Apportionment in 2019 – a figure just over \$98,000. This money helps fund ministry throughout West Virginia and mission work throughout the world. Thank you for your faithful attention to being good stewards which allowed us to reach this goal.

The Community Emergency Assistance Fund (CEAF) continued to make a difference in the lives of our greater community last year. This fund is supported by your faithful giving to our General Fund; it is included as a line item in our general budget.

In 2019, our church helped with 190 cases of emergency utility assistance. Of these, there were 167 unique households; 17 households received assistance more than once. With this fund, we are able to help families avoid utility disconnect, reconnect services, and place deposits on new services. Families are referred to us by DHHR, domestic abuse advocates, food banks, CASE WV, and other churches. Our pledges combine with those from other churches and assistance agencies to make this happen – it is truly a community effort that God works through!
