# <u>Not Quite Home</u>

Okay, I know that those letters look very strange together. As someone in my family would probably say, "You need to 'buy a vowel' there, Scott." But believe it or not, these five little letters are very important to us as members of the United Methodist Church. They stand as reminders to all of us of the vows we take when we join the church to uphold it with our "Prayers, Presence, Gifts, Service and Witness." So what does this mean?

**PRAYERS** – The Bible speaks often of prayer, but when I think about our membership vows, the verse that comes to mind first for me is: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18) It is a reminder to us that prayer is something that we should do all the time and that it is something that should be done in the attitude of rejoicing. God has given us the incredible invitation to communicate with Creator of the entire universe as we "uphold our church."

I know that many of us remember to pray for people within our church as they have needs and concerns – we have one of the most dedicated groups of prayer warriors that I have ever witnessed in a church. However, one of the other things that we need to do without ceasing is to pray for every ministry of the church with rejoicing in our hearts. Give thanks for what God has done, is doing and will do. The greatest impact you will make in God's Kingdom begins with prayer. Join one of the prayer groups at the church! Start each day and end each day with a prayer for some part of the church and be in an attitude of rejoicing as you pray! God will do mighty things through us as we speak to him and allow God to speak to us.

We have three groups that meet for prayer that goes into "upholding" the church and you are welcome to join any of them. Women's Prayer group meets on Tuesdays at 2:00 pm. There is a Men's Prayer Breakfast that meets on two Fridays a month – watch the bulletin. There is also a prayer group that meets on Sunday morning at 9:30 in the Parlor. All of these groups focus on upholding the church in prayer!

**PRESENCE –** I know that by now almost everyone realizes that we failed to meet our attendance goal for 2014. We had set it at 180 and did not even average 170. The interesting thing about this average to me is that if those who are active in the church just show up 75% (3 of 4 Sundays) our average attendance would be over 190! And if half of those people would bring a friend to church with them once a month...well, you can see where that would go. We promise God when we become members of the local congregation that we will uphold that congregation with our presence. This is not about anyone in the church being upset with how often anyone else attends – it is about living out a promise we made to God.

But "presence" goes even deeper than just attending worship. I can be at home with my family for dinner but not be "present." (Please don't ask them for examples of this...just trust me that I am guilty as charged!) Presence is about giving our attention, our love, our very being to those who are

around us in the church. We promise to "uphold" the church with our presence – so let's just watch in 2015 how many times we find ourselves being present with other church members.

BTW...our goal for 2015 in attendance is 185. What can you do to uphold the church with your presence this year?

**GIFTS** – Here is yet another area of our membership vows that has many meanings. Promising to uphold the church with our gifts does mean that we will use those spiritual gifts we have for the good of God's Kingdom but it also means that we will remember that financial stewardship is a key part of relationship with God.

Stewardship is all about caring for that which does not belong to us. The spiritual gifts we have – to teach, to pray, to uplift, to discern, to lead, to serve, to speak – are not OUR gifts to give to God. They have been given to us by God for us to use in the Kingdom. When we fail to do so, we are not letting anyone down but God...and yes, that is a huge understatement. The same is true of our financial gifts. They are not "ours" to use as we see fit. They are gifts to us from God that we are to give back to God in order for our relationship with God to continue to grow. Every time we withhold a gift that belongs to God, we are only hurting ourselves because it is our promise that we are breaking.

## Not Quite Home, continued

**SERVICE** – If prayers, presence, and gifts were not enough for us to offer to God when we joined the church, we also make a vow to uphold the church through our service. In short, that means that we will give our time to God's Kingdom just like we give everything else. There are so many ways that we can uphold the church through service – let me just point out a few:

Music Ministry – right now our Director of Music or our Band/Handbells Director would love, love, love to have you be a part of the choir, the band or the handbells. They are not looking for people who are professional musicians but they are looking for people who have a love of music and the gifts to share. Our choir, especially, has lost several members and I know that I would love to see that Chancel filled again in 2015. Is that a reasonable goal for us? *Is God calling you to service in this way?* 

Ministry in the Community – Our youth group is currently working on serving meals on Wednesday evenings in the downtown area. This area of service is looking for people who are willing to prepare food as well as those who are willing to go into the community and share God's love with just a little time and compassion.

Hospitality – Kim and Tom Bay are our new Hospitality Leaders this year and they will be looking for all kinds of service. Greeters for several areas of the church campus are being looked at and we will also have need of people who are willing to make a "doorstop" delivery to people who are guests in worship. Check with them to see how you can serve.

**WITNESS** – We end our vows with what I like to call the "invisible/visible vow" in our hymnal. If you look for the word in the printed vows, it is not there, however, our General Conference added it to the vows after the hymnals were printed. And yet, this is the most visible vow that we take. What does our life say about what matters to us the most? What do our words say are important to us? How are you being called to uphold the church with your "witness" in 2015.

I really did not set out to write such a long article for our first newsletter of 2015 but I just thought I needed the reminder as much as anyone else about what it means to be a member of God's Church! Please know that I share these words with rejoicing in my heart and hope that the best is yet to come for a Church in the Heart of Princeton.
