From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise. Philippians 4:8 Common English Bible

Pastoral ministry is filled with ups and downs. There are the heights of watching someone give their life to Christ for the first time, rededicating their life to Christ, and even watching someone's eyes light as they hear God calling them to participate in a particular ministry. There are the high times of watching children truly in love with God and seeing more experienced adults hold on to faith with every ounce of energy they can muster. There are the wonderful times of seeing a church come together in prayer or ministry and watching a person have their life changed forever by the love of a congregation.

There are also some low times...listening to people complain about something that seems trivial to me (although I know it is not trivial to them). Seeing brothers and sisters part company over disagreements about things we cannot know for certain until we meet with Christ. It is difficult to watch people slowly back away from their community of faith and have no understanding of why they are doing this. And sometimes the hardest thing of all to witness as a pastor is someone who is neither excited about their faith or really ready to search for something new. Yes, I think that is the hard-est...watching someone just wither away.

Over the past few months I could have focused upon some negatives if I had chosen to do so. There are always plenty of them to focus upon.

But something tragic happened to me and I was forced to see how un-Christian it would have been for me to focus my thoughts upon these things. As most of you already know, my Dad died.

I know from experience with so many people that losing a parent is a life changing event. I've seen it time and again but this time I experienced it. And in the midst of that experience what I saw was the overwhelming love of Christ being poured out by congregations and colleagues. This congregation – A Church in the Heart of Princeton – has given and continues to give me the space that I need to grieve and heal. You have been caring beyond mere words. Your prayers have lifted my spirits. Other congregations I have served reached out with notes, calls and well wishes. My colleagues, such as our District Superintendent, Dr. Joe Kenaston, have also been there to support me and my family. I cherish Dr. Kenaston's willingness to spend a Sunday preaching in my place to allow me to have my final Sunday with my Dad. (I also must say that this congregation did a wonderful job welcoming Dr. Kenaston and thanking him for his help. I especially appreciate Dr. Norman Jones' note of appreciation given to our Superintendent!)

The writer of Philippians is absolutely right. We must focus upon those things that are admirable, holy, true, just and pure. It has been in focusing upon those things that I have truly seen a way towards healing and hope that I need during these days of loss and grief.

Now, don't get me wrong...I still have high hopes and vision for this congregation. We are still

Here is the much requested festive cookie recipe from Shirley Evans:

Oatmeal Cranberry White Chocolate Chunk Cookies

2/3 cup butter, softened

2/3 cup brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt

1-1/4 cups Craisins dried cranberries

1-1/2 cups old-fashioned oats

1-1/2 cups flour

2/3 cups white chocolate chunks or chips

Preheat oven to 375* F. Using an electric mixer, beat butter and sugar together in a medium mixing bowl until light and fluffy. Add eggs, mixing well.

Combine oats, flour, baking soda and salt in a separate mixing bowl. Add to butter mixture in several additions, mixing well after each addition. Stir in dried cranberries and white chocolate chunks. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on wire rack. Makes approximately 2-1/2 dozen cookies.

Shirley was also the "Mystery Chef" who made the wonderful pineapple/ cream cheese dessert (called "Pretzel Salad") for the Christmas dinner. She also shared that recipe with us so, please let me know if you'd like a copy.





pressing forward to average 180 people in worship each week. If even one tenth of the people who reached out to me during my time of need would find someone outside of any congregation in need of that same support, we would surpass that goal.

Because I am focusing on these things, I am still pressing us forward to fully participate in the mission and ministry of our denomination by paying 100% of our Conference Apportionments. Although our goal for this year is to be 10% closer to that participation level, I truly believe we can surpass it with little sacrifice on our part.

By keeping my vision aligned with that which is admirable, holy, true, just and pure as the writer of Philippians reminds us, I also will press forward toward the vision of our congregation being a place where people "Trust and Become..." How will we know we are becoming that? By continuing to see growth in the number of Professions of Faith in our congregation. In 2015, six people professed their faith in our congregation. The WVAC had a goal of five people for 2015 and again for 2016. OUR goal for 2016 is ten people and I know, I know that we can reach that as the people of faith who reached out to me in my time of need also identify people OUTSIDE our congregation who need the same love that I received. It is true...If you want to see someone give their life to Christ, then be the very love of Christ to that person!

Once again, Pam, Erin, Allie and I all thank you for being so faithful during our time of need. I will miss my Dad terribly – his faith was an inspiration to me. But what I will focus upon is the admirable, holy, true, just and pure faith you have shared with us to see us through this time.
