# UPCOMING DISCIPLESHIP CLASSES

## Fear of the Other

There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear, because fear expects punishment. The person who is afraid has not been made perfect in love. We love because God first loved us. If anyone says, I love God, and hates a brother or sister, he is a liar, because the person who doesn't love a brother or sister who can be seen can't love God, who can't be seen. This commandment we have from him: Those who claim to love God ought to love their brother and sister also.

1 John 4:18-21 (CEB)

Pastor Scott will be offering a Discipleship Class that addresses overcoming the divided nature of relationships in the church and world today and based on the book Fear of the

Other by Bishop William Willimon. This is a five-week study that encourages participants, who may be anywhere in their growth as disciples, to explore whom they consider the "Other" to be in their lives and communities and begin regarding the Other from a Christian perspective. By the end of this Discipleship Class, those who participate will hopefully find that they are able to:



- identify the Other in their midst;
- train their fears by seeking additional information and relationships with those they fear;
- renew their commitment to embracing the Other in obedience to God's instruction;
- and work to make their local church more welcoming of the Other.

This five-week study will be offered on Wednesday evenings from 6:00 pm to 7:15 pm in Schell Hall starting August 15 and running each week until September 12. Those who wish to participate are encouraged to sign up as early as possible by calling or emailing the church office so that resources can be available for them to take the course.

# The Gospel of Mark - First among the Synoptics

The Wednesday evening Discipleship Study will focus on the Gospel of Mark starting Wednesday, September 26, and running through November 14. We begin at 6:00 pm and end at 7:30 pm.

This particular study will look at the whole Gospel, find ways to relate different portions of the Gospel to our everyday lives, and also offer help to people who might want to lead discussions on the Gospel in other small group settings. No special book is required for this study – just show up!! (Pastor Scott does want you to know that the class will be reading the entire Gospel EACH week between classes.)

Lamps to Remind Us that We're Connected

"I have prepared a lamp for my anointed one." -Psalm132: 17b

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." - John 1: 1-5.


Lamps will be a symbol seen throughout our annual conference this year. The lamp is a symbol of enduring and unbroken succession. Lamps denote faith and wisdom, the faith and wisdom that come from the Lord alone.

Many years ago, I went on a mission of peace to the eastern block of Europe. As a part of that experience I made a presentation in a Church in Germany about peace.

That congregation gave me a candle, a peace candle, that I was to take back to my congregation as a reminder to pray for peace among the nations, and specifically to remind our congregations – one in Germany and one in the United

States – of our connection with one another and that we had a Christian responsibility to build relationships with each other, learn about each other, and to pray for each other as part of our commitment to building peace around the world.

This year I went back to Germany. As I entered into one congregation after another, I saw the same candle sitting on the altar or communion table. I came to find out that at the annual conference in Germany, each congregation was given the same candle and each congregation was asked to place this candle on their altar or communion table and use it as a part of their



commitment to praying for and with each congregation in the annual conference in every worship service. The candles bound the churches of the German conference together in prayer and hope for their future mission and ministry throughout the world.

What a powerful witness for being one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world. What a powerful witness this could be for the congregations of the West Virginia Conference in the midst of these anxious times we are in as The United Methodist Church.

West Virginia Conference, Christ is among us in these anxious times. Christ came into this world to bring life, and his life is the light of all people, our light, and the light of all people. And, no power of darkness will overcome the light and life of Christ.

Each of us individually and as a congregation are called to prepare the way, to shine the light for our anointed one, Jesus Christ. As a symbol of our commitment to the enduring and unbroken succession of Christ, and our dedication to seek the faith and wisdom that come from Christ, and because we need to remember that we are connected in the ministry of Christ and need one another's prayers to amplify the light that Christ brings, each of the West Virginia Churches will receive the gift of an oil lamp following the Saturday evening prayer service.

The same oil lamp is being given to each church\*. I am asking that each congregation place this lamp on their altar or communion table as a call to prayer and as a reminder that we are connected and that we need one another in the West Virginia Conference and around the world to advance the mission and ministry of Christ.

We are better together in sharing the light, hope, and life of Christ than we are separately.

May God bless the lights of these lamps as a reminder that we can trust in the presence of Christ to bring life, hope, light to all people and that we are called to bear testimony and witness to the light and love of Christ in the living of these days.



# FROM THE PASTOR

(Jesus said) <sup>19</sup>"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to obey everything that I've commanded you."

Matthew 28:18-19a



Of all the things I heard at Annual Conference this year, one thing stuck in my mind. Rev. Junius Dotson was preaching and reminding us what was the single most important step we make in the church. To help us understand, he used an illustration from baseball. "If a runner makes it to first base and then never advances beyond that, then nothing is really accomplished. You can't win the game by staying on first base."

He was reminding us that as Christians there is so much more to following Christ than just accepting him as our Savior. We must be ready to move off of "first base" and get in the rest of the game to become a true disciple.

I am sometimes amazed at the number of people who think that being

a Christian is all about their personal salvation. They want to accept the forgiveness that Jesus offers. They want to avoid sin in their own life so that they can be holy like Jesus. But there are some who never want to become disciples.

Mature disciples are those followers of Jesus who know that after salvation there is so much more that can be done. Spiritual practices draw them not only closer to God but those practices pull them out into the world where they can find others looking for meaning and mission.

Mature disciples are those followers of Jesus who know that worship attendance is not only something that they do every week, but it is something that affects the way that they work and play.

Maturing disciples realize that the journey is not over at salvation and the desire that they have to give to the Lord through faithful giving to their church is something that completely reorients their view of resources so that they can free up more and more money to give to God's Kingdom.

Those disciples that leave first base know that being Christ-like is not just learning about the sin they should avoid but more about learning to love people – even difficult people and people who hurt them – just the same way that Christ did.




